Fostering a Culture of Reading at MCC,

benefits of reading for pleasure shows clear evidence that children and teens who read for the sheer enjoyment of it do better across a whole range of measures - from academic achievement to social skills to emotional health and wellbeing - than those who aren't readers.

In order to get a picture of our students' reading habits, at the end of 2017 all students in Year 7 to 9 were asked to complete our End of Year Reading Survey. In all three year groups over 90% of students identified themselves as 'okay' or

book for fun, 63.5% of Year 7, 50% of Year 8 and only 37.9% of Year 9 students responded 'yes'. This highlights that even though our students identify themselves as capable of reading they are choosing not to read.


I would like to congratulate Year 7 students on their positive start to the year. In addition to lots of learning experiences in the classroom there are a number of events in
